## FAMOUS NOVELISTS WRITES TO THE PRESIDENT F SENEGAL BASSIROU DIOMAYE DIAKHAR FAYE

ongratulations on your assumption of power as the new President of the Republic of Senegal. Our congratulations also go o your Prime Minister

and brother in arms, Mr. Ousmane Sonko. With this brilliant election, which not one of your rivals contested, the Senegalese people have not chosen you as their master but as their servant. We have no doubt whatsoever that you will live up to this expectation. We have never met in person but all Africa, indeed the world, has met you and we know that your youth gives Africa hope.

Thats why we are writing to you as both your African elders and admirers.

Up to now, except for a few leaders like Kwame Nkrumah, the African leadership has betrayed African people. They have simply normalized the abnormalities of Colonialism and neo-colonialism which is simply the Africanization of the colonial system. Our resources have continued to develop Europe and the West. As we only look up to the West, one wonders where our inventors are? Our engineers? Our space explorers?

Africa longs for a leadership that can fire the imagination of the continent's youth. But we cannot do that when our leadership simply mimics, always imitating the West, with no belief in ourselves, in our people. You are in a

position to steer Senegal onto a new and different path towards a collective self-confidence, relating to the world on the basis of equal give and take. But if you choose that path, you will create enemies in the West. The West wants an Africa that always gives to Europe and the West. Don't accept an inequity which will be at the expense of your people. And if they demonize you for that, just care, accept any other judge than the Senegalese people. Let us now share a few thoughts. We've chosen to focus on the language problem because as writers were familiar with it, but also because, in our humble opinion, the resolution of the language problem is a prerequisite for any economic, political, social, and cultural revolution and therefore for the well-being of your compatriots. These are some points we want to

1. Your Power is the Senegalese people. You defend them, they defend

You speak to them they speak to you. But you cannot do that using a language they cant understand. It is as simple and self-evident as that.

2. Senegalese languages must be the bedrock of the new Senegal. Every Senegalese has a right to their mother tongue. Avoid hierarchy of languages. So, mother tongue first, be it Pulaar, Seereer, Soninke, Wolof Mandinka or Joolaa or any other language spoken in Senegal.

But if one Senegalese language, say

Wolof, becomes the language that enables conversation among all the other Senegalese languages, that is good. The language policy: Mother tongue first. Then say, Wolof. Then say Swahili, French etc.

If you know all the languages of the world, and you don't know your mother tongue, that is mental enslavement. But if you know your mother tongue, and add all the languages of the world to it, that is empowerment.

3. Encourage translations among Senegalese languages. This is a

particularly important point for us. To that end, set up a national interpreting and translation center that would enable a symbiosis and a cross-fertilization between the languages of your country, and between them and the languages of Africa and the world.

Your Excellency, many Africans appreciated the fact that during your first official visit to the Gambia, you and President Barrow spoke directly to each other in Wolof.

We also know that, unlike your predecessors, you make most of your speeches in both French and Wolof, and we think that exactly the right thing to do. Make your speech in a Senegalese language and then make it available in all the other Senegalese languages. And then in French etc. At the United Nations, speak in a Senegalese language. You can have it translated and or interpreted into French or English, as necessary. In other words, do what all other Presidents in the world do; they make their speeches in their languages. In France, with a French President, speak to him in a Senegalese language. You have an interpreter with you etc.

In short, please invest in the Senegalese languages. And this must start with the repeal at the earliest opportunity of the strange article 28 of the Senegalese Constitution, which requires all presidential candidates to be able not only to speak but also to read and write French.

- 4. Organize the Senegalese farmers and workers. Fire their imagination. They are your defenders. Dontworry about all the self-proclaimed elites who have so much to lose in the development of your country's languages, and who are multiplying maneuvers and specious arguments to derail the train of History.
- 5. The works of Sembène Ousmane, especially God's Bits of Wood, and those of other literary giants like Cheikh Hamidou Kane should be available in all Senegalese languages. As for Cheikh Anta Diop, his books should be taught in all Senegalese
- 6. Progressive literatures from Africa and the rest of the world should be made available in Senegalese languages and also taught in Senegalese
- 7. Senegal first. Then Africa. Then Asia and Latin America. Then Europe etc. This should be reflected in the country's educational system.
- 8. Senegal must become a nation of thinkers, inventors, manufacturers, explorers, a nation of makers of things, relating to the world on the basis of equal give and take.

These are, Your Excellency, just a few thoughts from two African compatriots and well-wishers from Kenya and your beloved Senegal.

Kenyan single-party system started to crack in the early 1990s. He was a founding member of Forum for the Restoration f Democracy alongside Jaramogi Oginga Odinga. The forum soon split, and Odinga formed the Ford-Kenya party, while Shikuku Ford Asili with Kenneth Matiba. The 1992 general election were the first multiparty election in Kenya since the 1960s. Matiba was the Ford Asili presidential candidate, while Shikuku recaptured the Butere MP seat on Ford Asili ticket. Matiba later left Ford Asili and at the 1997 elections Shikuku was the party's presidential candidate. He did not get many votes and also lost his parliamentary seat. He died on August, at the Texas Cancer Centre in Hurlingham, Nairobi.

## **US says Rafah offensive would jeopardize** cease-fire talks as Biden threatens to halt **more Israel aid.**

he United States warned on Thursday that Israel will be dealing a strategic victory to Hamas if it carries out plans for an all-out assault on Rafah, the militants' last major stronghold in Gaza.

The warning was backed by a new threat from President Joe Biden: He says he will pause more offensive military assistance to Israel if it goes through with the operation in a city where more than 1 million civilians are sheltering.

Biden last week put on hold a shipment of large bombs to Israel over concerns the weapons are of the type that has caused significant civil-

"The American people support Israel overwhelmingly," said South Dakota Sen. John Thune, the No. 2 Republican, who pushed a resolution condemning Biden's decision. "And they also believe that Israel needs to do what is necessary, and if that includes going into Rafah to root out the Hamas threat, then that is necessary for their very survival."



ian casualties in Gaza and would almost certainly do more such damage if Israel conducted a major offensive in Rafah.

On Wednesday, he held out the possibility of holding up future shipments of bomb guidance kits and artillery to Israel, in hopes the threat would turn Israel back from an operation in the city.

The pronouncements are part of last-ditch push for Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and his farright government to rethink their public commitments to invade the city in an effort to eradicate Hamas. The U.S.

believes such a move would result in significant civilian casualties and exacerbate an already dire humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

The U.S. is making its sharpest moves yet to influence the decision-making of its ally in the ongoing war against the militant group that was triggered by Hamas' Oct. 7 attack on Israel. Some 1,200 people in Israel were killed and about 250 were taken captive.

"Our view is any kind of major Rafah ground operation would actually strengthen Hamas' hands at the negotiating table, not Israel's,"

White House national security spokesman John Kirby said Thursday. He said more civilian deaths in Rafah from an Israeli offensive would give more ammunition to Hamas' "twisted narrative" about Israel.

Talks in Cairo aimed at securing a six-week cease-fire to allow for the release of some hostages and a surge of food and aid to civilians in Gaza are continuing, Kirby added. But CIA Director Bill Burns and other delegations to the talks left Egypt on Thursday without a deal.

Kirby said it was too soon to know whether the aid holdup had altered the Israeli calculus, but that the U.S. was continuing to advise Israel on how it could defeat Hamas through more surgical operations.

"We believe that they have put an enormous amount of pressure on Hamas and that there are better ways to go after what is left of Hamas in Rafah than a major ground operation," he added.



Most people don't have signs and symptoms in the early stages of primary liver cancer. When signs and symptoms do appear, they may include:

Losing weight without try-

Upper abdominal pain Nausea and vomiting General weakness and fa-

Abdominal swelling Yellow discoloration of your skin and the whites of your eyes (jaundice) White, chalky stools

Liver cancer happens when liver cells develop changes (mutations) in their DNA. A cell's DNA is the material that provides instructions for every chemical process in your body. DNA mutations cause changes in these instructions. One result is that cells may begin to grow out of control and eventually form a tumor — a mass of cancerous cells.

Sometimes the cause of liver cancer is known, such as with chronic hepatitis infections. But sometimes liver cancer happens in people with no underlying diseases and it's not clear what causes

Factors that increase the risk of primary liver cancer include:





Severe weather events such as tornadoes, tropical storms, hurricanes, cyclones, floods, lightning strikes and extreme weather affect us all. In addition to weather forecasts are ozone levels, changing climate conditions and solar winds. Weather warnings are important forecasts because they are used to protect life and property. People use weather forecasts to determine what to wear on a given day or to plan travel or events. Since outdoor activities are severely curtailed by heavy rain, snow and the wind chill, forecasts can be used to plan activities around these events, and to plan ahead and survive them.



## Storm, tornado threat moves out of metro Atlanta.

Today's storms are part of a deadly system that has brought torrential rain and tornadoes across the country this week, from the Plains to the Midwest and now the southeastern U.S., the Associated Press reported. At least four people have died in storms since Monday.



A third line of srong storms rolled through metro Atlanta late Thursday morning, brin-

ging more widespread rain and prompting a tor nado watch and ground stop at Hartsfield-Jackson International Airport. led, according to Fligh-

The tornado watch was in effect until 1 p.m. and initially included all of North Georgia and the metro area. By late morning, the affected area shifted to the south of the city. A watch remains in effect for areas south of Macon, however, and two tornado warnings have been issued there, according to the National Weather Service. At the

airport, the ground stop was lifted at 12:45 p.m., according to the Federal Aviation Administration. A ground delay remains in effect until 6 p.m., as flights into Atlanta are running on a one-hour delay. At least two dozen flights have been cancetAware.

In southwest Atlanta, three trees were toppled or snapped in half along Cherokee Avenue near Grant Park, bringing a couple of power poles down with it, Channel 2 Action News reported.

John McVeigh, who lives in the area, was walking his dogs at the same time the trees fell. The wind

picked up for probably five or 10 minutes," he told Channel 2. "Kinda crazy, these guys — these dogs — were terrified and The intensifying storms hid inside, and next thing were a result of tem-I know, the trees were down."

No one was hurt, and the trees didn't hit any homes or vehicles.

The inclement weather pummeled counties north of the city overnight. The second wave arrived in the city shortly before 8:30 a.m., and the


